## What is GoWell?

GoWell is a ten-year research and learning programme that aims to find out from local people what they think of the efforts to improve their area and if this has an impact on their health and wellbeing. We have conducted surveys in your area already between 2006 and 2011. A planned final survey is being conducted this year. These surveys help us understand:

- what changes have taken place
- whether things have got better or worse
- and what changes are important to residents.

GoWell's survey findings are already being used by local communities, Glasgow Housing Association and other Registered Social Landlords, NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde and Glasgow City Council to help to improve services and regeneration efforts both now and in the future. As well as conducting surveys, GoWell also monitors regeneration and health changes across this city by

News from NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde is that the New Gorbals Health and Care Centre is due to open in 2017 on the Sandiefield site near Laurieston Road. When it is complete, the centre will be the new home for:

1) The services in the current Gorbals Health Centre (on Pine Place):

- four GP practices
- Gorbals Dental Practice and community dental services
- physiotherapy
- podiatry
- treatment room services
- district nursing and health visiting
- community clinics such as dietetics, diabetics, mental health etc.
- 2) Specialist Children's Services (currently in the Southbank Centre and the fifth floor of the Two Max building in Old Rutherglen Road):
  - community paediatrics
  - speech therapy
  - child & adolescent mental health services.
- 3) Social work services (currently in the Two Max building in Old Rutherglen Road):
  - children & families
  - homeless case work team
  - community addictions team.
